Team Up Mentoring

Our Community's Need 2 in 5

children live in low-income households in Hampton Roads. 1 in 3 children in Virginia live in single-parent homes. Youth living under both conditions are more at-risk of negative outcomes. But, at-risk youths with a mentor are 53% more likely to enroll in college and 130% more likely to hold leadership positions. They are also 46% less likely than their peers to start using illegal drugs and 27% less likely to start drinking.²

97%

of youth in Team Up mentoring do better in school and have improved relationships with family, friends and classmates. **154** volunteer mentor and youth matches were served this year.

In the food court, Chesapeake Police Officer Danya Tucker spied three boisterous teenage boys joking with a young man. Their behavior grabbed her attention, and she followed them to a kiosk by a bookstore. Entranced by how well-behaved the boys were, she asked the young man if he was their father. Micheal, 36-year old Team Up mentor of the three, exclaimed, "I'm too young to have teenage boys! I'm their mentor."

Micheal, a pastor, started with 15-year old Elijah, a bright boy with an eye for art but blind to his own smarts and talent. Micheal and Elijah share life experiences. Both are products of single parent homes with one parent in prison. Over two years, he took on Elijah's two friends. And, thanks to his commitment to helping youth realize their best, he now mentors Officer Tucker's 7-year old son.

"If we can get to young people at the right time, we can impact the shape of their lives in a major way," said Micheal.

Housing and Financial Counseling

Our Community's Need

Over

51,000

homes in Hampton Roads are over 90 days delinquent on their house payments.³ 1 in 2,104 homes were foreclosed upon in August 2017.⁴ Many of these homes belong to our country's veterans, with 14% of Hampton Roads' population consisting of retired military.⁵

Because of you...

145

families avoided foreclosure or eviction and kept their homes. Over **1,300** families received housing counseling and financial education. **80%** of education participants commit to make three or more positive financial behavioral changes (e.g. reduce debt, develop a budget, start or increase savings, etc.).




When Bob and Carolyn Page moved from New York to Virginia Beach, they found the home of a lifetime. The quaint house has been Bob's haven each evening, after 10-hour work days, 6 days a week, for several years. It's not only his sanctuary. Lush nature surrounds the house. And, it has drawn 112 species of birds that Carolyn has cataloged over 20 years.

In October 2015, Bob, an Army veteran, faced a fear he had never experienced -- the chance of losing their home. During the economic turmoil in 2008, he struggled to find work. Carolyn had lost her job, too. His unemployment ran out in September 2015.

The Pages picked up food from church pantries. Some days they went without water to keep the electricity on.

Then, they met Erica, a Housing Counselor with The Up Center. She worked to get mortgage relief to help them meet their monthly expenses. Because of her, the Pages kept an important part of their legacy. "Before, I could always trust coming home. There's something about not knowing where you're gonna live tomorrow. Today, I'm feeling much better, "said Bob.

children in Virginia were victims of abuse or neglect last year.⁶ 1 in 3 parents feel that they are under a great deal of stress. Only a third believe they are doing an excellent or very good job of managing their stress.⁷

Jennifer, a 33-year-old Norfolk resident, has been on her own since 16. In spite of a difficult upbringing, she has grown into a fierce, independent woman. motherhood posed a new, uncharted challenge. "I want to ensure I'm giving my son the best of everything, and that's difficult when you don't have that life experience to draw from," disclosed Jennifer.

Jennifer supports herself and one and half-year old son, Gage, through a full-time job. She also owns a photography business. Confident in business, money and self, she found that she was unsure when it came to the "norms" of raising a child. Jennifer found comfort in leaning on her parent educator, Brandie.

Jennifer confided, "As a new parent, there are often times where you feel like you don't know what you're doing. It's nice to have someone you can trust to call on for peace of mind or advice -- or a nonjudgmental person to vent to. Being a mom is the hardest job I've ever had."

Jennifer concluded, "I am very grateful to The Up Center for sending Brandie to me. I don't have family here, and most of my friends have yet to become mothers themselves. Thanks to Brandie's encouragement and home visits, my confidence as a mother has soared. I am determined to be the best mom I can be, and give Gage the best shot at a successful future."

youth ages 13-18 have, or will have, a serious mental illness. 50% of people with lifetime cases of mental illness are diagnosed by age 14 and 75% by age 24.8

25-year old Andrae enjoys playing video games, especially Call of Duty, at his Norfolk home, where he lives with his mom and stepdad. He also manages a schizophrenia diagnosis.

Before entering the Mental Health Skill Building program a year ago, he showed aggressive behavior towards his family. He even had run-ins with law enforcement. Thanks to the help of his clinician, Christina, at The Up Center, Andrae is now stable. He is consistent with his medications and visits to the psychiatrist.

Andrae has completed a job training program. His social and communication skills have improved. Last year, Andrae was able to exercise his civic duty and vote for the first time in the Presidential election. Now that Andrae is living more independently, he is looking forward to becoming the best man that he can be.







Therapeutic Foster Care

Our Community's Need **892**

children are currently in foster care in the Eastern region of Virginia.⁹ 1 in 4 youth experience a serious traumatic event by their 16th birthday, and may suffer multiple and repeated traumas.¹⁰ This includes the trauma and stress of being taken from your home and being shuffled from one foster placement to another. Such stress can interfere with children's ability to concentrate and learn.

84

children were placed in a safe and loving home – **15** of them were adopted. **7** children were reunited with their biological families.

Marcie is an elementary school teacher in Isle of Wight. She has spent the past decade aching to rescue the at-risk children in her pre-K class. She dreamed of providing one of them a stable and safe home. When her husband, Justin, a retired Marine, agreed to explore foster care and adoption, she was over the moon.

In three short years, they went from a family of five—the Cholewinskis already had three biological kids—to nine! A red-headed sibling pair were adopted last year, and the couple is fostering another sibling pair. The weekly seven loads of laundry and the upgrade to a 12-passenger van have been worth it. "You can always bring more children into your home," said Marcie.

Their biological kids are also supportive of Marcie's and Justin's journey. "This gives them an opportunity to experience different kids with different backgrounds. They have a chance to live in the real world—within the walls of their own home," said Marcie.




